Assistant Professor of Speech-Language Pathology Tenure-Track

The Speech-Language Pathology Program housed in the Department of Collaborative Support and Intervention at the University of West Georgia is seeking an individual to join our collaborative, entrepreneurial and dynamic department. This is a tenure track, ten-month appointment with the possibility of summer employment. The start date for the position is August 2011 pending availability of funding. Salary is competitive and commensurate with experience and qualifications.

Position Description

The successful candidate will assume a range of responsibilities including: (1) teaching, scholarship, and service appropriate for appointment in areas of speech-language pathology, (2) teaching graduate and/or undergraduate courses, (3) conducting meaningful research and scholarship (4) participating in broad-based college, university, and departmental committee work and professional service, (5) advising students, (6) supervising students in field experiences in various settings including clinics, schools, and agencies, (7) traveling to off-campus sites for teaching, supervision, research, and collaboration, and (8) involvement in professional organizations.

Required Qualifications

An earned doctorate in Speech-Language Pathology, Audiology or Communication Sciences/Disorders, AuD in Audiology or a related field from an accredited institution including Certificate of Clinical Competence (CCC-SLP or CCC-A) is required. The qualified candidate will have a specialization in audiology, speech science, aural rehabilitation, voice disorders, and/or organic communication disorders with a minimum of 3 years successful teaching/clinical experience and/or working in the field of communication sciences and disorders.

Preferred Qualifications

Desired qualifications include (1) experience in delivering and developing on-line instruction, (2) experience with service-based clinics, (3) commitment to collaborative work and innovative service and teaching, and (4) experience with securing external funding and managing projects.
