### **Assistant Professor of Instructional Technology Tenure-Track**

Department of Educational Innovation seeks qualified candidates for the position of Assistant Professor of Instructional Technology, 10 month, tenure track position with the possibility of summer employment. Position begins August 2011 pending funding.

#### **Required Qualifications**

Earned doctorate in Instructional/Educational Technology, Instructional Design, or a closely related field with knowledge of learning theories and assessment, instructional design, technology integration, and qualitative and quantitative research methodologies. Candidates must have excellent verbal and written communication skills and demonstrated commitment to teaching, service, and research. Candidates must have the ability to teach courses in Instructional/Educational Technology including Instructional Technology Issues, IT Theories, IT Practices, Technology Integration Across Content Areas, and Media Production (Multimedia, Video, etc.); have an emerging research/publication agenda in the areas of Instructional/ Educational Technology Research, Technology Integration, Curriculum Design and Development, or a closely related field; possess expertise in computers, computer applications, and emerging technologies related to Instructional Technology, Instructional Technology Research and/or Program Evaluation; have experience teaching to and communicating with students through distance and emerging technologies such as Blackboard, Open Source Applications, eCampus, Wimba, audio/video conferencing, Web 2.0 programs, etc.; be able to advise students in Masters and/or Ed.S. programs; be able to direct Educational Specialist research projects, action research, and program evaluations; be willing to work some evenings and weekends; be able to provide services, including limited travel, to schools and school systems throughout the state; and be able to take a leadership role in state and national professional organizations. Terminal degree **must** be awarded prior to position starting date.

#### **Preferred Qualifications**

Preferred candidates will have three or more years of P-12 school experience, a record of university teaching experience, and a record of grant writing and other activities related to seeking of external funding.
